DAY THREE TUESDAY 26 AUGUST 2025



Broome Half Day Tour

Enjoy a full breakfast at the Oaks Cable Beach Resort. At 9.00am you will commence a half day sightseeing tour of Broome. Enjoy a professional and entertaining introduction into "Broome Time" with an experienced local guide.

The guide's knowledge will enhance Broome's natural historical and cultural highlights. The tour includes Cable Beach, Gantheaume Point, here preserved in the reef rock for over 125 million years, are the footprints of long-extinct dinosaurs making it one of the best paleontological sites in the world. The footprints are only visible at low tide however you can view plaster casts of the dinosaur tracks embedded at the top of the cliff if the tide is high. Also at Gantheaume Point is Anastasia's pool, a natural spa pool modified by an early lighthouse keeper making its therapeutic warm water easily accessible for his wife who suffered terribly with arthritis. See breathtaking views of Entrance Point and Roebuck Bay, the Largest Japanese Cemetery in Australia which is witness to the perils faced by early pearl divers. Visit Town Beach which has a Diverse History and Magnificent Views and the outside display of the Broome WWII Commemorative Air Raid Artwork. Visit the Staircase to The Moon Lookout, and tour concludes in the heart and Soul of Broome Chinatown.

At the conclusion of the half day Broome sightseeing tour you will have the opportunity to be taken back to the Oaks' Cable Beach Resort (included with the tour) or enjoy the afternoon at leisure spending time looking around the town of Broome (transport back to the hotel is at your own expense). A public bus service is available from Broome to Cable Beach (a bus stop is located at the front of the Oaks Cable Beach Resort). Or you may prefer a taxi back to the hotel.

Broome to Port Headland

An early breakfast at Oaks Cable Beach Resort, before departing for Port Headland. Travel South down the Great Northern Highway through some of Australia's most remote countryside, vast rich red soil plains with spinifex vegetation. Enjoy your included packed lunch at one of the stops along the Highway. Eighty Mile Beach is where The Great Sandy Desert the 2nd largest desert in Australia stretches from Northern Territory to the ocean. Late afternoon we arrive into Port Headland, a natural deep anchorage harbour, and the region's major port for fuel and container receipt and exporting of Iron Ore. The Iron Ore is moved by railway to the port from four major deposits in the Pilbara region.

DAY FIVE THURSDAY 28 AUGUST 2025



Port Headland to Karratha

Enjoy your cooked breakfast at the Hospitality Port Headland, and continue the journey South to Whim Creek formerly known as Whim Well, the site of the first major mineral mine in Western Australia, now the town has nothing more than its landmark hotel built in 1886 to cater for the area's miners, sadly today even the hotel is closed. Roebourne with remnants of its historic National Trust buildings was once a thriving gold town, established between Geraldton and Darwin—a massive distance, today it is also the oldest surviving town in Western Australia's North West. Visit Mt Welcome Lookout for a scenic view of the land around you, the signage at the lookout outlines the history of the township and the significance of the lookout. Packed lunch is included and can be enjoyed at a scenic location.

Cossack originally named "Tien Tsin" after the boat which the first Settlers sailed into the area is the birthplace of Western Australia's pearling industry and was once home to thousands of people, after the move of the local pearling industry to Broome, the town's population started to decline and was completely abandoned in 1950. Locals are trying to breathe life back into Cossack and have restored eight of its heritage buildings to give visitors an idea of what the town was like back in its heyday. Point Samsom north of Cossack is a small coastal town that was once a busy port and now is one of the regions most popular holiday destinations.

Before arriving at our destination of Karratha visit Dampier located 20 kms from Karratha, Dampier port was opened in 1966 when the first Iron Ore from the Mount Tom Price Mine was transported via railway. Visit the Red Dog Grave Memorial a tribute to a much-beloved kelpie cross dog who was known to wander throughout the Pilbara, often tagging along on bus journeys across the region. The Red Dog movie was filmed around the Dampier region.

Karratha to Exmouth

This morning enjoy a Continental breakfast at the Comfort Inn and Suites Karratha before departing for Exmouth. Travelling down the North West Coastal Highway we cross the Fortescue River the 3rd largest river in Western Australia 760 kms in length. With spectacular scenery, rocky gorges along our journey arrive into Exmouth which is surrounded by beautiful coastline and the crystal-clear waters of Ningaloo Marine Park.

Exmouth to Coral Bay / Glass Bottom Boat Cruise / Travel to Carnarvon

Enjoy your full breakfast at Escape Resort. Today we travel down to Coral Bay for a one hour glass bottom boat cruise. Enjoy the stunning underwater views of the coral gardens and a multitude of fish through the underwater windows. With pristine white sand beaches and turquoise waters Coral Bay is an idyllic introduction to the breathtaking beauty of the World Heritage listed Ningaloo Reef. This afternoon we continue south crossing and stopping at the Tropic of Capricorn marker. As you approach Carnarvon the landscape changes to farming of tropical produce paw paw, mangoes, avocados, bananas Carnarvon being the first location in Australia where bananas were grown. Crossing the Gascoyne River the longest river in Western Australia at 865 km it is said to be an “upside-down river”, because it flows for about 120 days of the year and below the dry river bed for the remainder of the year. It is, in effect, a huge water storage system with the river aquifer lying below the desert sands.

Your day starts with a full breakfast, before touring Exmouth and its surrounds, see Vlamingh Head Lighthouse originally known as the North West Cape Lighthouse it provided guidance to sailors from 1912 to 1967. Explore Cape Range National Park and Turquoise Bay made famous for its crystal clear waters, turquoise seas and white sandy beaches. Enjoy your Yardie Creek cruise, along the protected water of Yardie Creek, a relaxing way to experience the spectacular colours and beauty of the rugged Yardie Creek Gorge. A packed lunch is included today for you to enjoy at a scenic location. There is a unique array of wildlife living in the gorge including the rare black footed wallaby and a wide variety of birds life. Returning to your resort relax and enjoy your evening.

Carnarvon to Shark Bay / Monkey Mia

After enjoying a full breakfast, your travel today is via Hamelin Pool, home of the most extensive living Stromatolite (micro-organisms) system in the world, the Stromatolites date back to the beginning of life on earth. Travelling along the Peron Peninsula a long narrow peninsula located in the Shark Bay World Heritage listed area you will see the beautiful colourful and diverse landscapes, also the area is home to rare fauna and flora. Shark Bay is located on the most western point of the coast of Australia. Stopping at Eagle Bluff lookout enjoy a short walk along the boardwalk, take in the dramatic breathtaking views out across the water of Denham Sound.

Our journey continues arriving into stunning Monkey Mia famous for its wild dolphins and, surrounded by rusty red sand dunes and white sandy beaches. Relax and enjoy your evening.

Kalbarri to Geraldton

A leisurely breakfast this morning, the first stop is at Red Bluff Lookout with amazing views of the rugged spectacular coastline, 100 metre cliffs shaped by the forces of wind and waves of the Indian Ocean.

A pretty drive with stunning landscape and coastline, you will see the spectacular Hutt Lagoon Pink Lake that covers roughly 70 Square kilometres with most of the lagoon lying a few metres below sea level. Port Gregory a small scenic fishing village that is situated with one side of the Pink Lake and the picturesque coral reef on the other side.

Nearby is the Lynton Convict Hiring Station's stone buildings which once housed convicts who had a ticket of leave and worked in the nearby Lead mine. The convict facilities were built in 1853 and the depot closed in 1856.

Northampton is one of the oldest towns in Western Australia having been declared a town site in 1864, it was classified by the National Trust in 1993. Important heritage buildings have been conserved and are still in use. During the day on your journey there may be opportunities to see the beautiful wildflowers, including the Geraldton wax, a popular wildflower with many varieties and colours.

Arriving into the city of Geraldton that overlooks the Indian Ocean you will visit the HMAS Sydney Memorial, decorated with glorious gardens commemorating the loss of 645 men on 19 November 1941. See St Francis Xavier Cathedral which began construction on 20 June 1916. Geraldton exports grains, iron ore, minerals and has a lucrative fishing industry.

Monkey Mia Wild Dolphins / Travel to Kalbarri

An early breakfast today, before your encounter with the wild Indo-Pacific dolphins, for more than 50 years the dolphins have visited this beautiful white sandy beach. These dolphins are wild and strict guidelines for feeding apply so that the dolphins can continue to hunt and behave naturally. However although rare there are days when the dolphins do not visit the beach.

Later this morning your journey from Shark Bay to Kalbarri continues, driving via Denham, the township of Shark Bay region. Stopping at Shell Beach, this beautiful beach as the name applies is made up of trillions of tiny shells of the Fraquum cockle and in places deposits of the shells are 10 metres deep. Rejoining the North West Coastal Highway travel south over the Murchison River through Kalbarri National Park to the picturesque resort town of Kalbarri, your home for 2 nights.

DAY ELEVEN WEDNESDAY 3 SEPTEMBER 2025



Day Touring Kalbarri National Park including Kalbarri Skywalk, Nature's Window, The Loop, Z Bend and Spring Wildflowers

After enjoying breakfast, you will visit nearby Kalbarri National Park one of Western Australia's most popular places to visit. The National Park is surrounded by the lower reaches of the Murchison River. The river has cut a magnificent 80 km gorge through the white banded sandstone. Perched right on the cliff top two platforms of the Kalbarri Skywalk jut out over the gorge, the views from the Skywalk are incredible. Other lookouts in the park include the famous Nature's Window where the vista is seen through a massive red rock frame. Other popular viewing places are The Loop and the iconic Z Bend named because of a sharp bend in the river.

During Spring, the Wildflowers are exceptional in Kalbarri National Park, vivid displays of colour, abundance and variety appear each year. You will have time to explore and enjoy the beautiful Wildflowers of the park.

DAY THIRTEEN FRIDAY 5 SEPTEMBER 2025



Geraldton via Cervantes to Perth

Enjoy your breakfast, leaving Geraldton we continue south through Dongara stopping for a photo opportunity of the Greenough Trees – this area is characterised by river red gums which have given up defying the prevailing winds and bent themselves almost parallel to the earth in an attempt to escape the salt wind blowing off the Indian Ocean. From here, we travel along the coast to the town of Cervantes, a small coastal cray fishing town with beautiful white sandy beaches and turquoise waters. Visiting the Lobster Shack the guided tour is a firsthand look of the lobster industry, from the video presentation of the boats to viewing the LIVE Western Rock lobsters being sorted and prepared for their journey to destinations around the world. After the tour enjoy your included lunch of Fish and Chips.

Departing Cervantes you will visit the truly remarkable Nambung National Park, home to Western Australia's Pinnacles. Like a moon scene, ancient strange- looking limestone pillars stand in a yellow-coloured sandy desert. Some of the ancient pillars reach up to 3.5 metres tall, Nambung National Park is spectacular when its wildflowers bloom from late Winter to the end of Spring. Continuing the journey arrive into Perth, Western Australia's Capital city and your home for two nights.

Can I take a walking frame on a tour?

Unfortunately, we cannot accommodate walkers on some of our tours. Our transportation typically does not have the space to store a walker and all physical ratings require that guests must be able to get on and off transportation unaided. If you wish to travel with a walker please contact us in advance of making a booking.

Can I take a walking stick on a tour?

Yes, taking a walking stick on tour is perfectly fine as long you are able to meet the fitness rating for your chosen tour.

What happens if I book a tour with the wrong fitness level?

We discuss fitness ratings with all our guests as part of the booking process to ensure you book a tour that's right for you. If a guest has misrepresented their fitness level and cannot keep up with the tour activities, they be asked to return home.

What are the fitness levels?

Fitness levels are important when selecting a tour. Every tour has a Physical Rating of 1–2:

1. Easy
2. Active/Moderate

Relaxed pace tours – Level 1 fitness – Easy

These tours are at a more relaxed pace and generally we unpack once. You don't have to worry about doing anything physically demanding unless you want to. The tour is primarily coach travel but the day tours may have content that requires disembarking vessels/vehicles with stairs to which you have to do unaided.

Passengers must be able to:

- Participate in guided or unguided small walking tours at a relaxed pace
- Walk on mostly level ground
- Tackle an occasional flight of stairs or incline
- Occasionally need to stand for up to 10 minutes
- Get on and off transportation unaided
- Manage your own luggage.

Tours with some mild physical activities – Level 2 fitness – Active/Moderate

There are some easy physical activities included in these tours and an average level of fitness is required to gain maximum enjoyment.

Passengers must be able to:

- Participate in walking tours with time to rest at least every 10 minutes
- Walk confidently on bush tracks and soft sand – mostly level ground
- Stand for 15 minutes without needing to sit down
- Tackle a flight of stairs or incline
- Get on and off transportation multiple times unaided
- Manage your own luggage

Travelling with a carer

If you are unable to travel alone and feel that the fitness levels required are not obtainable, you can travel with a carer or chaperone. Coach drivers and staff are only permitted to provide basic assistance. Drivers and staff are unable to assist with access to facilities, lift or carry passengers, administer medicines or perform any medical procedures.

Travelling with a medical condition

If you have a medical condition, it is recommended that a carer/chaperone accompany you on your journey. In the event that you become ill during the journey, the appropriate emergency services will be contacted and the continuation of travel will be determined by the emergency services personnel. Our coach drivers and staff are not trained or permitted to administer any medicines or perform medical tasks.

Special needs

Should you have any special needs, you are required to inform us at the time of your booking. Special needs include (without limitation) if you have any disability, illness, disease or other condition, you have limited mobility, you have a service animal, you are pregnant, you need special help or any other circumstances exist which may make it difficult for you to use travel services.
